PRODUCE SAFETY RULE INSPECTION

Federal regulation mandated under the Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA) in 2015.

OVERVIEW

GOOD AGRICULTURAL PRACTICES (GAP) AUDIT

Third-party certification that verifies farm practices for buyers.



Health and hygiene Animal management Soil amendments Water quality Post-harvest handling **Equipment sanitation**

KEY TOPICS

Same basic topics as inspection, with variety of add-on options for buyers, such as traceability programs and sustainability metrics.

ADMINISTERED IN WASHINGTON BY

WSDA Fruit and Vegetable Inspection Program conducts **USDA** Audits.

Washington State Department of Agriculture

Yes, but some small, direct marketing farms and products are exempt.

Certain records are required. A food safety plan is recommended.

> Inspectors record violations and corrective actions. Enforcement protocol is under development.

MANDATORY?

No, but some buyers require it.



REQUIRED?

A food safety plan with policies, procedures, and records.

EVALUATION CRITERIA

Typically a point-based checklist.

Every couple of years, depending on corrective actions needed.

> No Cost - inspections are federally funded.

VISIT **FREQUENCY**

COST

Most certification programs require annual renewal.

\$100 - \$200 per hour depending on the program.
