



#### ✓ Procured 146 unique varieties of food, supporting cultural familiarity and diverse diets. Examples include leeks, green onions, fava beans, bok choy, nopales, perilla, purslane, mushrooms, oats, and hazelnuts.

- ✓ Strengthened hyper-local relationships between food producers and food banks. 77% of food purchases traveled less than 30 miles from farm to distribution site.
- ✓ Distributed over 7,600 plant starts in 17 varieties to engage clients in growing their own food. Created a standardized calculator that projected a yield of over 16,000 lbs. of produce from plant
- ✓ Elevated client voices through the implementation of a Photovoice study to evaluate F2FP through participant-led discussions. Qualitative findings will be shared to increase program impact.
