WSDA Focus on Food & Other Updates – Katie Rains, WSDA

 Anticipating the budget forecast coming out this afternoon. WSDA policy and fiscal staff have been providing technical assistance to budget staff at OFM as well as both the House and the Senate, who are asking questions and trying to understand the fluctuating funding levels of the Food Assistance network, especially over the past 5 years.

- This week is the 5-year anniversary of the initial COVID-19 stay home directive, and WSDA wants to express our respect and appreciation for those individuals serving in a Hunger Relief Organization (HRO) these past five years, as the operating environment continues to change.
- WSDA is monitoring bills relevant to food policy, though WSDA did not request this legislation:
 - o HB1404 / SB5352 Free School Meals
 - o SHB1388 / SSB5214 Mobile Markets
 - o SB5474 / HB1588 Organic Agriculture
 - o HB1497 (Food) Waste Materials Management
 - SB5055 Promoting WA Agritourism
 - HB1987 Developing a WA Food Security Strategy
- State legislative session
 - The final day of the 105 day "Long Session" is Sunday 4/27/25
 - House & Senate budgets anticipated next week, available here: https://fiscal.wa.gov/
 - WSDA will look closely at budgeted investments in food security and agricultural viability in the proposed budgets. A conference budget is not expected until April 21st or later.
- Federal funding impacts
 - On March 7th, USDA announced that LFPA25 awards nationwide, which were announced in December 2024, had been terminated. These "new" LFPA25 funds, \$8.5 million in total, were allocated to the WSDA Director's Office for implementation of a direct vendor/farmer purchasing model in 2026. Additional changes to existing LFPA Food Assistance awards have been communicated directly by Food Assistance staff.
 - The USDA Resilient Food System Infrastructure (RFSI) grants that WSDA recommended to USDA in September 2024 have not yet been approved for award and are on hold until additional communication is received from USDA. These 7 grant projects do not directly impact Food Assistance programs, but do impact food systems across the state.

Advocacy Updates - Claire Lane, Aaron Czyzewski, AHNC

- Thank you to those who came to Hunger Action Day. It was a little chaotic but we got really good feedback from participants and legislators.
- Economic forecast comes out today 2pm. Expecting a \$15B deficit, concerned about cuts.
- House and Senate will have four new major tax bills after the forecast comes out.
- Expect the Senate to come out with a more robust budget and revenue, investing in K12 education obligations and transportation investments.
- Thanks to all who signed the letter to protect our priorities. Impressive number and variety of signers. Letter will be shared later today [see attached].
- Please sign in to hearings to support revenue bills. Info will come later. Don't sign up for testimony until after talking to Claire or Aaron, to assist with strategy.
- Next, the House and Senate need to reconcile the budgets.
- Call your legislators to support hunger relief. Share the impacts in your community.
- Contact Claire to sign up for newsletters, sign up for advocacy alerts through Food Lifeline's website. Food Lifeline also posts to social media, follow for updates.
- Kudos to Seattle Food Committee, Family Works Food Bank, and Sound Generations for helping draft an Op-Ed so soon after the Governor's budget press conference. The Seattle Times will run the Op-Ed later this week. <u>Link to article</u>.
- Also Public News Service will run an article about Northwest Harvest's Rent Stabilization Bill that
 has a hearing on Wednesday. The article covers rent stabilization and how it affects hunger and
 the connection between housing and food insecurity. <u>Link to article</u>.
- Senator Amy Klobuchar emphasized the 3 C's: Courts, Congress, Constituents in responses. It's
 important to share the impacts you're seeing, the work that you do, giving recent examples to
 Congress.
- Congressional Spring Recess April 12-27th.
- Congressman Rick Larsen is holding a Food Security Round Table
- Governor proposed cuts to food security, open to negotiating, but need to hear from you.
- Also developing the Capital Budget, more pressures in the operating budget on food security
 creates more responsibility for the capital budget. Please reach out and advocate if you have
 related projects. Representative Lisa Callan is the Vice Chair of the Capital Budget Committee.



Federal Updates - Kim Eads, WSDA FA

- TEFAP CCC is a source of food, valued between \$16-18M/year. Our expectation was that we would get Year 3 with three phases. Phase 1 had begun and was delayed with no warning. We aren't sure if it's going to get cancelled or delayed, we don't know if we'll get Phase 2 or 3. If we don't get Phases 2 or 3, that will be about \$12M in food absent from the system.
- CSFP State Plan approved, TEFAP State Plan pending 400% Federal Poverty Level Income Eligibility
- FFY25 CSFP & TEFAP Budgets Continuing Resolution through 9/30/25
 - We don't have direct communication from USDA. These are educated guesses.
 - o Anticipate more information from USDA on the Total Budgets
 - Unlikely that CSFP will be granting expansion requests (Impacts VOA & CDCAC) nothing official from USDA to date.
- TEFAP R&R Budget Reallocation pending USDA Approval (still no final word this week?)
 - Don't expect future rounds
- TEFAP Farm to Food Bank
 - Don't expect future rounds
- LFPA and LFPA Plus (federal) and LFPA Gap (state)
 - New Plan created through 6/30/25, amendments will be sent by the end of the week
- USDA Management Evaluation of TEFAP/CSFP May 12-16
 - Site Reviews May 13-15 (most likely Thurston/Mason/Lewis/Pacific/Grays Harbor/Pierce)
- Questions/Comments
 - Understand LFPA is cut from the USDA budget correct? No funding after 09.30.25
 - Not all states have the same deadline. WA deadline is 6/30/25. LFPA25 has been cut, but current funding is intact, but no extension beyond 6/30/25.
