The Worker Protection Standard (WPS) requires agricultural employers to post pesticide application information at a place where workers and pesticide handlers are likely to congregate and where it can be easily seen and read. Information must be legible. **See reverse for additional instructions.**

Central Posting — Pesticide Application Information — Instructions

- The Worker Protection Standard (WPS) requires agricultural employers to post pesticide application information at a place where workers and pesticide handlers are likely to congregate and where it can be easily seen and read. Information must be legible.
- The pesticide application and hazard information for each pesticide product applied must be displayed no later than 24 hours after the end of the application of the pesticide. The hazard information consists of copies of the Safety Data Sheet for each pesticide product.
- The pesticide application and hazard information must be displayed continuously from the beginning of the display period until at least 30 days after the end of the last applicable restricted-entry interval, or until workers or handlers are no longer on the establishment, whichever is earlier. HOWEVER: Workers cannot enter any area where a pesticide has been applied until (1) the applicable pesticide application and hazard information for each pesticide product applied to that area is displayed and (2) after the restricted-entry interval has expired and all treated area warning signs have been removed or covered.
- Workers and handlers must be allowed access to the location of the information contained in this form at all times during normal work hours.
- The pesticide application and hazard information must be retained for two years after the date of expiration of the restricted-entry interval for the pesticide applied.
