WSDA Resources:

TEFAP: The Emergency Food Assistance Program and the Trade Mitigation Program, provide federal USDA food and limited operational funding to emergency food providers.

Community Services of Moses Lake supporting 4 TEFAP food pantries and 0 TEFAP meal programs.

Allocated Operational Funding: \$117,107
Estimated Pounds of Food: 990,228
Estimated Value of Food: \$870,278
Average Monthly Clients: 8,713
Average Monthly Households: 3,384

CSFP: The federal Commodity Supplemental Food Program provides a prescribed quantity of USDA food to low income persons at least 60 years of age.

Estimated Pounds of Food: 78,131
Estimated Value of Food: \$43,452
Average Monthly Clients: 180


EFAP: The state Emergency Food Assistance Program provides state funding to help pay for administrative, operational and food costs of emergency food providers.

Allocated Funding: \$137,587


4 emergency food providers are directly supported with WSDA resources.

2019 EFAP Clients by Age Group




8,879 households served; 3.8 clients per household; 5.2 visits per year, per EFAP client.
