WSDA Resources:

TEFAP: The Emergency Food Assistance Program and the Trade Mitigation Program, provide federal USDA food and limited operational funding to emergency

food providers.

Blue Mountain Action Council supporting 1 TEFAP food pantry and 0 TEFAP meal programs.

Allocated Operational Funding: \$9,352 Estimated Pounds of Food: 79,081 Estimated Value of Food: \$69,501 Average Monthly Clients: 227 Average Monthly Households: 67

CSFP: The federal Commodity Supplemental Food Program provides a prescribed quantity of USDA food to low income persons at least 60 years of age.

food providers.



19.9 lbs. of food per EFAP client visit compared to the state average of 18.9 lbs.


2 emergency food providers are directly supported with WSDA resources.
