WSDA Resources:

TEFAP: The Emergency Food Assistance Program and the Trade Mitigation Program, provide federal USDA food and limited operational funding to emergency food providers.

Average Monthly Clients: 128


EFAP: The state Emergency Food Assistance Program provides state funding to help pay for administrative, operational and food costs of emergency food providers.

Allocated Funding: \$27,261


6 emergency food providers are directly supported with WSDA resources.
