WSDA Resources:

TEFAP: The Emergency Food Assistance Program provides federal USDA food and limited operational funding

to emergency food providers.

Olympic Community Action Program Supporting 5 TEFAP food pantries/sites and 1 TEFAP meal program.

Allocated Operational Funding: \$ 10,543.41 Estimated Pounds of Food: 54,765.97 Estimated Value of Food: \$ 48,136.12 Average Monthly Clients: 1,198 Average Monthly Households: 515

CSFP: The federal Commodity Supplemental Food Program provides a prescribed quantity of USDA food to low-income persons at least 60 years of age.

EFAP: The state Emergency Food Assistance Program provides state funding to help pay for administrative, operational and food costs of emergency food providers.


Olympic Community Action Program Supporting 4 EFAP food pantries.

14.2 lbs. of food per client visit compared to the state average of 17.9 lbs.


6 emergency feeding organizations are directly supported with WSDA resources.
