### WSDA Resources:

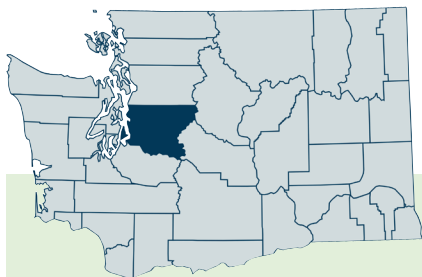

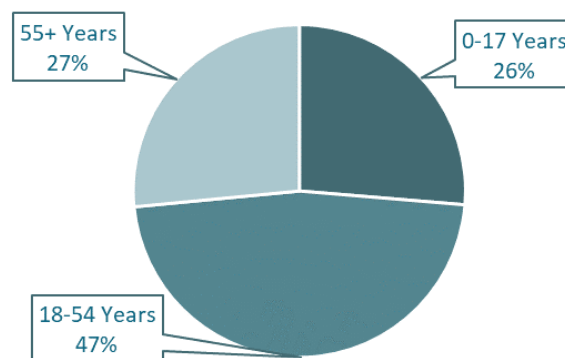
