### WSDA Resources:

**TEFAP:** The Emergency Food Assistance Program and the Trade Mitigation Program, provide federal USDA food and limited operational funding to emergency food providers.

**Community Action Council of Lewis, Mason, & Thurston Counties**

*supporting 9 TEFAP food pantries and 6 TEFAP meal programs.*

Allocated Operational Funding: \$117,514  
Estimated Pounds of Food: 993,666  
Estimated Value of Food: \$873,300  
Average Monthly Clients: 7,996  
Average Monthly Households: 2,857

**CSFP:** The federal Commodity Supplemental Food Program provides a prescribed quantity of USDA food to low income persons at least 60 years of age.

Estimated Pounds of Food: 277,366  
Estimated Value of Food: \$154,255  
Average Monthly Clients: 639

**EFAP:** The state Emergency Food Assistance Program provides state funding to help pay for administrative, operational and food costs of emergency food providers.

**Saint Vincent de Paul - Bremerton**

*supporting 8 EFAP food pantries.*

Allocated Funding: \$140,184

**22.7 lbs.** of food per EFAP client visit compared to the state average of 18.9 lbs.




