WSDA Resources:

TEFAP: The Emergency Food Assistance Program and the Trade Mitigation Program, provide federal USDA food and limited operational funding to emergency food providers.

Coastal Community Action Program
supporting 3 TEFAP food pantries and 1 TEFAP meal program.

Allocated Operational Funding: \$24,804
Estimated Pounds of Food: 209,736

CSFP: The federal Commodity Supplemental Food Program provides a prescribed quantity of USDA food to low income persons at least 60 years of age.

Average Monthly Clients: 30


EFAP: The state Emergency Food Assistance Program provides state funding to help pay for administrative, operational and food costs of emergency food providers.

Allocated Funding: \$28,899


4 emergency food providers are directly supported with WSDA resources.
