WSDA Resources:

TEFAP: The Emergency Food Assistance Program provides federal USDA food and limited operational funding

to emergency food providers.

Second Harvest of the Inland NorthwestSupporting 29 TEFAP food pantries and
6 TEFAP meal programs.

Allocated Operational Funding: \$ 124,753.55 Estimated Pounds of Food: 1,348,756.04 Estimated Value of Food: \$ 881,790.49 Average Monthly Clients: 15,364 Average Monthly Households: 6,223

CSFP: The federal Commodity Supplemental Food Program provides a prescribed quantity of USDA food to low income persons at least 60 years of age.

Allocated Operational Funding: \$79,147.23 Estimated Pounds of Food: 380,069.65 Estimated Value of Food: \$272,299.07 Average Monthly Clients: 1,132

EFAP: The state Emergency Food Assistance Program provides state funding to help pay for administrative, operational and food costs of emergency food providers.


Second Harvest of the Inland Northwest Supporting 21 EFAP food pantries.

31.6 lbs. of food per client visit compared to the state average of 17.5 lbs.


39 emergency feeding organizations are directly supported with WSDA resources.
