WSDA Resources:

TEFAP: The Emergency Food Assistance Program and the Trade Mitigation Program, provide federal USDA food and limited operational funding to emergency

food providers.

Second Harvest of the Inland Northwest supporting 31 TEFAP food pantries and 7 TEFAP meal programs.

Allocated Operational Funding: \$326,111 Estimated Pounds of Food: 2,757,510 Estimated Value of Food: \$2,423,482 Average Monthly Clients: 14,386 Average Monthly Households: 5,835

CSFP: The federal Commodity Supplemental Food Program provides a prescribed quantity of USDA food to low income persons at least 60 years of age.

food providers.


Second Harvest of the Inland Northwest supporting 21 EFAP food pantries.

43.1 lbs. of food per EFAP client visit compared to the state average of 18.9 lbs.


38 emergency food providers are directly supported with WSDA resources.
