### WSDA Resources:

**TEFAP:** The Emergency Food Assistance Program provides federal USDA food and limited operational funding to emergency food providers.

**Community Services of Moses Lake**  
Supporting 1 TEFAP food pantry/site  
and 0 TEFAP meal programs.

Allocated Operational Funding: \$ 57,840.27  
Estimated Pounds of Food: 404,812.83  
Estimated Value of Food: \$ 355,807.03  
Average Monthly Clients: 8,973  
Average Monthly Households: 3,353

**CSFP:** The federal Commodity Supplemental Food Program provides a prescribed quantity of USDA food to low-income persons at least 60 years of age.

Supporting 3 CSFP sponsored sites.



Allocated Funding: \$ 137,910.83


**17.5 lbs. of food per client visit**

received food from an EFAP food pantry compared to the state average of 1 in 6.


**4 emergency feeding organizations**
